POHNPEI, Federated States of Micronesia - The Military Sealift Command joint high speed vessel USNS Millinocket (JHSV 3) arrived in Pohnpei, Federated States of Micronesia, June 21 for the ship's second stop of Pacific Partnership 2015.

Millinocket and embarked Task Force Forager, led by an expeditionary command element from the Navy's 30th Naval Construction Regiment (30 NCR) from Port Hueneme, California, are currently serving as the secondary platform for Pacific Partnership 2015. The primary platform for the mission is the Military Sealift Command hospital ship USNS Mercy (T-AH 19).

"My crew and I are incredibly excited for our visit to the Federated States of Micronesia," said Capt. James Meyer, Commodore, Task Force Forager. "We look forward to meeting with the national and local leaders and all the people of the community. Military and civilian leaders all agree it is necessary for us to work together to respond quickly and effectively to natural disasters. This mission helps build that ability while simultaneously providing

KOLONIA, Pohnpei - Task Force Forager, embarked aboard the Military Sealift Command joint high speed vessel USNS Millinocket (JHSV 3), kicked off its second visit of Pacific Partnership June 22 with an opening ceremony and reception onboard the ship.

Kolonia, Pohnpei, Federated States of Micronesia (FSM) acting governor Marcelo Peterson expressed his gratitude for the work that Pacific Partnership will be completing in Micronesia.

Globe to Globe Hamlet thrills Pohnpei audience

Pohnpei, FSM—Phoebe Fildes has been performing in the same show in a different country every few days since April of 2014. As part of the Globe to Globe tour, it's been Shakespeare's "Hamlet" over and over again in over 113 countries so far.

"But it's not the same show really," she said during an interview the day after the troupe, by all accounts performed yet another stunning performance, "I'd say that in the last 15 months we've only duplicated the exact cast roles once or maybe twice."

The cast members can and do handle several roles. Fildes says that it keeps things interesting on their long journey. All of the cast members of Shakespeare's Globe are schooled professional actors and musicians. But if the actors played the same role night after night opposite other players who also played the same roles night after night, the performance could become stale. Fildes says that each show has a freshness for the actors and therefore, a freshness for the audience.

The model is brilliant really.

Last night's show at the College of Micronesia FSM certainly was another kind of challenge for the crew of The Globe Shakespeare.

With no explanation, Fiji Airlines simply didn't carry the 1700 or so pounds of costumes and sets the troupe normally uses to stage their show. The crew won't see their gear or their luggage until they arrive in Taipei which won't be until after they perform in Palau tomorrow night.

"Look, it's certainly not the first time," their road manager said during yesterday's pre-performance rehearsal during which the troupe completely re-blocked the show in order to deal with the absence of their props. She said that when the troupe arrived at the airport on their way to Tonga, they were told that due to the coronation going on there each passenger would be limited to just over 23 kilos of luggage (a kilo is 2.2 pounds). "It was a shock and we did a lot of scrambling."

"That's actually been quite liberating to strip down to the bare essentials", Fildes said.

Some who saw last night's performance said that the absence of props and costumes probably made the show even more unique. Many credited the incredible talent of the actors with making the performance work even though they were wearing street clothes and had "make do" props.

And work it did, with a bit of creativity and outright inventiveness. The crowd was captivated; fascinated by the performance right down to the English accents of the

performers.

"The themes in 'Hamlet' are universal no matter what language they (the audience) speak," Fildes said. "What does it mean to be alive. What is the meaning of life? Everyone asks themselves those questions."

Knowing the plot of "Hamlet" and its themes, we worried that some of those might resonate in a negative way with an audience in Pohnpei, or anywhere else for that matter.

Fildes said that until she did a performance in a country in North Africa that we will not name but that has a reputation for repressive government policies, she hadn't really thought too much about what repercussions the themes of the play might bring about.

The troupe had been told in advance of that performance that they might have to tone down the play. They might have to remove some of the elements of the high church that are prevalent. Of course, the women would have to be modestly clad. They were willing

to do all of that and did.

In one of Hamlet's most famous soliloquies, he reveals that he is completely torn apart by the murder of his father for what amounted to political reasons. He is so distraught that he feels he must act. He must do something rather than sit and let it pass. He must take revenge. Fildes said that the soliloquy resonated with the audience in the North African country which reacted enthusiastically. She said that started her thinking about the message. Ultimately she decided that Shakespeare's play doesn't condone revenge or violent means to an end.

"It ends with a stage littered with dead bodies," she said. "It doesn't condone revenge."

The performance was enthusiastically received in Pohnpei.

Before her engagement with Shakespeare Global, Phoebe performed in the hit West End production of Once the Musical at the Phoenix Theatre. She grew up in the countryside of Cheshire, surrounded mostly by family, dogs and ducks. Though she grew up playing violin and thought that was what she'd like to do, acting is her chosen profession. She vows that her performances during the Globe to Globe Hamlet tour will not be the last that we see of her.

medical, dental, veterinarian, engineering and civic assistance."

Pohnpei State Police confiscate and destroy marijuana plants in Mwoalok

Pohnpei, FSM—On the 25th, day of June 2015, Pohnpei State Police Detectives received a report from an anonymous informant about a marijuana plantation in the community area of Mwoalok, Sokehs Municipality.



Immediately police detectives gathered more supporting evidence that led to an approval of a legal search warrant from the Pohnpei State Supreme Court on the evening of the same day that authorized law enforcement officers to search the premises of the plantation site.

On the early morning of June 26, 2015, Pohnpei State Police with the assistance of Sokehs Police Department executed the search warrant and confiscated more than 20 marijuana bushes on the property.





FSM athletes competing in 2015 Pacific Games

The 2015 Pacific Games will be held in Port Moresby, PNG from July 4-18. Twenty-two Pacific islands nations will compete in 28 sports, with an estimated 4,500 athletes and coaches. The FSM delegation – TEAM FSM – will be 40 FSM athletes and coaches and will compete in Boxing, Tennis, Weightlifting, Swimming, Soccer (Football) and Swimming. The head of TEAM FSM (Chef de Mission) is Castro Joab.

The Pacific Games opening ceremony will be held on Saturday, July 04, with newly elected FSM President Peter Christian attending. The TEAM FSM flag bearer will be Manuel Minginfel, world famous Olympic weightlifter from Yap. Manuel's first appearance at a Pacific Games was at the Mini Games in Pago Pago, American Samoa in 1997. Since that time, he has competed in every single Pacific Games and Mini Games, winning a total of 19 gold medals and 5 silver medals. In Port Moresby, he will be competing for the first time in a new bodyweight category for him - 69kg category. In January, Minginfel received an Olympic athlete training scholarship to train and try to qualify for the 2016 Rio Olympic Games.

The FSM men's soccer team has been training on Guam the past few weeks. The team comprises 18 soccer athletes from Yap, Chuuk and Pohnpei. The soccer athletes are: Mikson Kuka, Paulis Jeikek, Scott Rudolph, Roger Nakasone, James Macarthur, Ioane Kariti, Franson Simeon, Kacy Alton Olmos, Michael Reyes, Mark Jones, Jacob Nam, Dominic Gadad, Aaron Bayow, Jonothan Garayog, Devon Figirmow, Walter Pongkagnan, Benjiman Gilmoon and Javin Kognang. The head coach of the team is Stan Foster (from Australia). The assistant coach is Curtis Graham. The soccer athletes and coaches were selected by the leaders of the FSM Football Association. By competing in the games, the association is hoping to become a member of FIFA (international football association). The training camp on Guam was funded and organized by the FSM Football Association. The FSM National Olympic Committee provided a \$50,000 grant that funded airfare, insurance, travel stipends and accommodation costs in Port Moresby.

For the first time, FSM will be competing in Boxing. Three male boxers from Pohnpei, Derick Perman, Royce Rott and Angelo Rodriguez will compete. One female from Yap, Jennifer Chieng will also compete. She currently trains at Gleason's Gym in Brooklyn, New York, USA, under Coach Devon Cormack and Heather Hardy who is the current WBC International Female Super Bantam weight Champion. In January, Chieng received an Olympic

athlete training scholarship to train and try to qualify for the 2016 Rio Olympic Games. The FSM Boxing coach is Erick Divinagracia who is also the President of the newly formed FSM Boxing Association. The Boxing athletes and coaches were selected by the leaders of the FSM Boxing Association. The FSMNOC funded the airfare, insurance, travel stipends and accommodation costs for the FSM boxers.

TJ Apis, attending the Oceania Tennis Institute in Fiji, will be representing the FSM in Tennis. He is ranked in the top 5 of his age group in the Oceania Tennis player rankings. Apis will be coached by Ronald Etscheit.

Debra Daniel, 2-time Olympian, and Dionisio Augustine will be competing in Swimming, and will be coached by Sweeter Daniel. In January, Daniel received an Olympic athlete training scholarship to train to attempt to qualify for the 2016 Rio Olympic Games.

Kitson Kapriel, 100 meter run gold medalist of the 2014 Micronesia Games, Roy Elwise, Pahnrasco Ardos, Penter Pluhs and Lihen Jonas will be competing in Athletics (Track and Field). The runners will be competing in the 100m, 200m and 4x100m relay. The runners will be coached by Rendy Germinaro.

Alvin Ruemau, Einstein Perman and Minginfel will compete in Weightlifting. The lifters will be coached by Ronald Etscheit. The Tennis, Swimming, Athletics and Weightlifting athletes and coaches

were selected by each sports national federation. The FSMNOC funded these athletes and the coaches' airfare, insurance, travel stipends and accommodation costs from a special International Olympic Committee (IOC) grant for \$30,000.

The FSM had hoped to send a men's Fast-Pitch Softball team to the games but the sport was cancelled due to lack of teams. The FSM would have also been competitive in Wrestling but it is not on the sport program of the 2015 Pacific Games.

TEAM FSM wishes to thank the Office of the FSM President and the FSM Department of Health and Social Affairs for funding team uniforms and a \$200 stipend for all TEAM FSM athletes and coaches. 2015, National Law Day Debate, July 9, 2015

The Supreme Court of the Federated States of Micronesia was established on July 12, 1981 as the highest Court of the Nation. In celebrating the inception of the FSM Supreme Court or the Judiciary branch, the FSM Supreme Court organizes and sponsors a National Law day Debate each year which is done between all high schools at the state level and which is then followed by a national level debate between four representing high schools, one for each respective state. The FSM Supreme Court chooses a topic, for which all high schools will debate upon at the state level and with the winning high schools advancing to compete at the national level on July 12. The first law day debate was conducted on July 12, 1991 which commemorate the first ten years of the existence of the FSM Supreme Court. Since then, the National Law Day Debated has become an annual event of the court. July 12, 2015 will mark the thirty fourth anniversary of the FSM Supreme Court and mark the twenty fourth law day debate celebration. One of the main purposes of this event is to allow students or the young people throughout the Nation to engage in and voice their thoughts on important issues that leaders of the Nation deals with in the government.

Since July 12, 1991, the first Law Day Debate, over \$200,000 scholarship funds had been issued to students participating in the National Law Day debates. This scholarship money comes from funds

appropriated by the FSM Congress, in kind donations from interested individuals, and sponsors given in response to solicitation by the Court. This scholarship fund is given to help tuitions cost and school supplies during a participants first semester in College.

It is time again for the nation to commemorate the inauguration of our National Judiciary System. The Supreme Court of the Federated Stated of Micronesia is hosting a National Law Day debate at the FSM Supreme Court, Palikir Pohnpei on July 9th, 2015 since July 12th, 2015 falls on Sunday.

The topic for this year is:

“BE IT RESOLVED THAT TITLE 53, SUBTITLE II, OF THE FSM CODE IS AMENDED, TO ALLOW INDIVIDUALS 60 OR OLDER, WHO HAVE VESTED IN THE FSM SOCIAL SECURITY SYSTEM, TO RECEIVE 100% OF THEIR SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS, AND THE WAGES EARNER’S CONTRIBUTION SHALL BE RAISED ACCORDINGLY TO PROVIDE THE ADDITIONAL REVENUE TO ACCOMMODATE THE CHANGE IN THE LAW”

- 2.Kosrae State- Kosrae High School
- 3.Pohnpei State- Our Lady of Mercy Catholic High School
- 4.Yap State

High level economic cooperation delegation from China meets with Pohnpei Legislature

Pohnpei, FSM—A high level economic delegation from Beijing, China composed of both government officials and business leaders paid a formal visit to the Pohnpei State Legislature and Acting Governor Marcelo Peterson in Legislative chambers this evening.

According to the Embassy of the People's Republic of China, the delegation is in Pohnpei to explore ways that the FSM and China can further develop economic cooperation between the two countries.

Senator Aurelio Joab served as Master of Ceremonies for the formal meeting which included remarks by Speaker Fernando

Scaliem and a representative of the Chinese government.

Both governments expressed the desire to work together for strengthened economic cooperation in the areas of infrastructure, agriculture, and "related fields".

"It is a blessing and a golden opportunity for Pohnpei State to be an economic partner with China," Speaker Scaliem's message in the program for the event said. That message described China as "a country with the world's second largest economy, largest trader in goods, largest holder of foreign exchange reserves, third largest outbound investor and the largest trading partner with nearly 130 nations. We hope to realize a lasting cooperation and partnership with China, and seek your economic assistance and guidance as we strive to develop our



meager economy now and in the years to come."

The FSM Department of Foreign Affairs and the Pohnpei State Legislature held a reception at Cupid's Bar and Grill later in

the evening. The Chinese delegation is headed by Mr. Ma Hui, Director-General of the International Department of CPC.

Ground breaking for Sekere Multi-Purpose Gym Project

Pohnpei, FSM—State and local officials gathered with Japanese Ambassador Masaki Sakai at the Sekere All-Inclusive Elementary School for a ground breaking ceremony for what will be the Sekere Community Multi-Purpose Gym Project funded by the Government of Japan.

"About two years ago, there was a dream, a dream that we envisioned to bring us together and unite us all as one community with the same purpose and goal," said Nixon Ludwig, President of the Sekere Community Youth Association (SCYA). He said that in addition to sports activities the new facility would "shelter education activities, medical activities or missions, and cultural and traditional presentations." Referring to the recent Tropical Storm Dolphin and the damage that it did in the Sekere community, he

said that the new center could also serve as a temporary refuge center during times of natural disaster.

Ludwig said that members of SCYA immediately began to seek funding from government resources. Finding that financial resources were meager in Pohnpei, the group nearly abandoned their dream. But in September of 2014 they met with officials at the Japanese Embassy who, along with the Pohnpei Department of Education, helped them to prepare a grant proposal to the Government of Japan. The grant was ultimately approved and in February of this year the grant documents were signed.

Ambassador Sakai spoke of the friendly relations between the FSM and Japan and reintroduced a Japanese word that has already become part of the FSM lexicon. "Kizuna" refers to the bonds of friendship and certainly applies between

the people of FSM and Japan.

As often happens in Pohnpei and particularly in Sekere, rain fell during the ceremony. Ambassador Sakai spoke of the blessing of rain for crops and other uses but said that there are certain activities that simply can't take place in the rain. He said that the new facility will allow the people of Sekere to participate in sports and other activities even when the weather would not normally allow it.

VCS Construction won the bid for the construction of the facility and owner Jose San Nicolas took part in the ground breaking ceremony. Staff members at VCS say that construction should begin in early July.



Director of Treasury and Administration spoke on behalf of Acting Governor Peterson, who was unable to attend the ceremony. On behalf of the Sokehs Government, Chief Magistrate Michael Liemen addressed the small crowd. Joseph Villazon spoke as the Director of Pohnpei's Department of Education.

Senior Pastor Lepty Herry blessed the project with a word of prayer before the groundbreaking. 10 officials and members of the SCYA ceremonially turned the first spade of earth symbolizing the start of construction. Afterwards, 10 students and teachers were chosen to do the same.

Pastor Perez Amaraich provided the benediction.
